

### Investigation Results

971/1012 Investigations have been initiated:

167/180 Investigations remain active: 18%

804/832 Investigations are closed: 82%

114/118 Individuals were identified that had been previously convicted of the crime: 14%

159/163 Requests for indictments have been completed against persons or DNA profiles: 16%

- 106/110 named suspects (40 multi case suspects) 67% of indictments
- 53/53 John Does (2 suspects on one case) 33% of indictments
  - 25/26 John Does are now named (7 multi case suspects) 49% of John Does
  - 1 Named John Doe is deceased

77/81 victims/suspects are deceased: 10%

- 17/18 suspects (does not include the deceased John Doe) 2%
- 60/63 victims: 8%

118/126 victims declined to participate: 15%

29/30 unable to locate victim: 4%

184/192 cases past the statute of limitations: 23%

27/27 prosecution declined: 3%

26/26 insufficient/degraded DNA: 3%

28/28 cases no crime occurred: 3%

42/42 consensual partner: 5%

- Justus Onyeigo 36
- 2004 Rape
- Victim was stranger abducted off the street.
- 2014 Indictment
- Found at home in Mississippi and arrested
- Jury trial first week of June; Found guilty.
- Sentencing July 11<sup>th</sup>; facing 30 years at 100%


