### **Funding to Improve the FedEx Forum:**

From the Memphis Tigers, to the Memphis Grizzlies, the City of Memphis has a special connection to the world of sports and entertainment. Opened nearly twenty years ago, the FedEx Forum has been the centerpiece of NBA playoff runs and NCAA tournament drives, bringing Memphians together in the process. To that end, the Council is supportive of the venue within our community. As such, today we approved a resolution appropriating \$2,863,363.56 of assigned fund balance for the purpose of meeting contractually obligated Capital Expenditures for improvements to the FedEx Forum.

### **Maintaining our Public Works Infrastructure:**

The Council also has an eye toward maintaining our public works infrastructure, namely our sewers. Therefore, today we approved a resolution accepting \$15,000,000 from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund. The monetary amount will be used for a City-wide sewer collection system assessment and rehabilitation program.

Additionally, a second and third resolution were approved transferring and appropriating a total of \$1,696,706 in construction funds to rehabilitate a flood control pump station on North Second Street, near Marble Avenue.

Taken together, these actions work toward the upkeep of infrastructure used to keep the City of Memphis clean and healthy.

# **Supporting our Public Libraries:**

The Council values the role of the Division of Library Services as a resource within Memphis neighborhoods. Today, we approved a resolution to accept, allocate, and appropriate grant funds in the amount of \$9,035 from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives. The monetary amount will be used for technology equipment to deliver outreach programming at Memphis Public Libraries across all Memphis City Council districts.

## **Upcoming Decisions:**

Save the date. On Tuesday, November 17 the Council will discuss the MLGW budget, with a possible vote that same day.
