CITY OF MEMPHIS CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE With local requirements for a State of Tennessee-issued RETAIL FOOD STORE WINE LICENSE (Administrative Fee \$100, Non-Refundable)

Instructions/Procedures

In order for a retail grocery that derives at least 20% of its tax revenue from food sold for human consumption that is at least 1,200 feet in square feet is eligible to obtain a "Retail Food Store Wine License" issued by the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC). Prior to such a license being issued, the applicant must obtain a "City of Memphis Certificate of Compliance" which is required by Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-3-806 (a) and (b). There are only two factors that the Mayor can consider in terms of issuing such a certificate. The first is the named applicant has provided to the City of Memphis proof of a background check on the "applicant or **applicants**" who are to be in actual charge of the business, and, if a corporation, the executive officers or those in control, showing that all such persons have not been convicted of a felony within a ten-year period preceding the date of this application. It is of utmost important that you note that if the applicant is a corporation, background checks must be provided for "the executive officers or those" in control and the Certificate must not be issued if any one of the applicants has had a felony in the 10 years preceding the application. The second is the applicant must provide evidence that the location is in an eligible zone which generally will require either a zoning letter issued by code enforcement.

Procedure:

- 1. The applicant completes the application.
- 2. The applicant provides the necessary background checks.
- 3. The applicant submits that the location meets the current zoning ordinance.
- 4. If so, the applicant pays the \$100 administrative fee and the Permits Office transmits the form to the Mayor.
- 5. The executed document is sent to the TABC.
